## **Mable Kirk**

NOV 24, 1922 - FEB 2, 2021

**M**able Kirk, 98, of Frazeytsburg, Ohio passed away Tuesday evening, February 2, 2021 at Genesis Morrison House in Zanesville. Her loving family was at her side.

Born November 24, 1922 in Twelve Pole Creek, West Virginia she was a daughter of the late Amos and Lilly (Moore) Williamson. She was a homemaker and a loving mother, grandmother and great grandmother. Mable was always happy and had a great sense of humor. She loved to quilt and made many beautiful quilts over the years. She loved cooking and baking pies and was well known for her delicious chicken and noodles. Mable attended Rocky Fork First Church of God in Newark and Trinity Full Gospel Church of Zanesville.

Surviving is one son and daughter in-law, Tyrone and Beverly Kirk of Frazeytsburg; one daughter and son in-law, Patricia and Michael Holtz of Nashport; five grandchildren, Kimberly Holtz, Matthew Holtz, Brandi Kirk, Tanaya Kirk and Tai Kirk and five great grandchildren.
