Randy E. Little, 67, of Zanesville, Ohio died Friday afternoon, June 26, 2020 at his home.

Born May 7, 1953 in Zanesville he was a son of the late Robert F. Little and Wenda J. (Longaberger) Little of Dresden.

Randy was a 1971 graduate of Tri-Valley High School where he was a multi-sport standout and is a member of the Tri-Valley Sports Hall of Fame. Following high school he attended West Liberty State College where he excelled in football, earning a starting position for four years. He earned WVIAC first team all-conference in 1972, 1973 and 1974. In 1974 he was WVIAC co-conference player of the year. Following his playing career at West Liberty he was selected by the World Champion Pittsburgh Steelers in the 1975 NFL draft. In 1999 Randy was inducted to the West Liberty Hall of Fame.

Randy was a member of Chi Nu Fraternity and a member of the United Carpenters and Joiners of America Local Union 200 where he worked as a carpenter for many years.

Surviving is his mother, Wenda Little of Dresden; his loving wife of nearly 39 years, Cheryl A. (Wood) Little whom he married August 5, 1981; two sons, Jason (Anna) McBride of Westerville, Ohio and David (Amanda) Little of Lithopolis, Ohio; one daughter, Danielle (Adam) Hardwick of Granville, Ohio; two grandchildren, Lily and Theo Hardwick and a brother, Steven (Chris) Little of Lake Placid, Florida. Also surviving are several cousins, aunts, uncles, nieces, nephews and many friends.

Randy was preceded in death by his father Robert F. Little and a brother, Jim Little.

You see in first grade my Dad died on Thanksgiving Day. Randy, Dee May, and Tom Prince were the first class mates to invite me to their homes to stay over after that happened. From that point on, I had a friend in Randy. We both had great moms, Randy Lincicome, Randy Little, all through school, I was proud to be next to Randy. Our lockers, seats, pictures in yearbooks, and championships. For example in baseball for Fulks, we batted 2 and 3 in the line up and played first and second next to one another and were Tri-Champions. In basketball we got two championships during our two years as teammates 69-70 and 70-71 teams. It was during the J-Hawks years we both became sport enthusiasts. Randy was "Little Jeff", and I admired Paul Prince. All the years I played with Randy or against him there was always a strong mutual respect between us even though we played on different teams or people we ran around with. Randy and I always had had a deep appreciation for the class of 1974 and a particular football linebacker, basketball guard, discuss and shot putter in the class of 1975. Randy rode to work and was a teammate of Tom Harrier, Tom and I were teammates in college for three years. About the only issue we ever argued over was the sports page our jr. year in study hall where Mrs. Martin was the librarian. If I had it first, I would hear this voice, hurry up Lintz, you see our seats were next to one another. And we never dinged pennies off of the metal shelves either. I also had the great pleasure of meeting his son Jason, at Hocking State Park where we played chess around the campfire. A few years later I try to recruit Jason to ODC to play basketball when I was there. I didn't get him but I was happy for him when he played at my school OUZ. Randy always thanked me for taking an interest in Jason over the years when our paths crossed. I ran off 14 obituaries of Randy , for various basketball notebooks I have. That's another record for Randy. We played on 8 basketball teams together over the years. In 1971 I saw his first Gold Medal game when he scored 15 points for Birkhimer 's. We played in 1990 for Frazeyburg Merchants the last team we were on together. Randy was an outstanding semi-pro basketball player for Birkhimer's, Jrs. Bar, R.J. Drilling, Dresden Pepsi Merchants, and Frazeyburg Merchants. In 1974 he played a key role in Jrs. Bar winning the Ohio Parks and Recreation State Open Basketball Tournament. In college he was the best basketball player on campus at West Liberty State College and he didn't play on their team. In the Wheeling area he was all tournament in two separate semi-pro basketball tournaments. The two tournaments that picked him all tournament, Randy was the only player, still in college. Randy when you arrive at Heaven's Gate :There will be your Dad, Jim, My Dads, My Mom, Tom Harrier, Larry McKitrick, Neil Miller, Larry James, Oz, Tom McBride , Clayce Kishbaugh (he thought the world of you), and a host of J-Hawks, Scotties, and Hilltoppers to hand you a basketball and a hammer. Then God will give you your wings to go along with your unique "tip it" and back up after it rebounding technique that you developed over the years. P.S. Randy you also get the record for my longest condolence breaking the one I wrote last summer for my close friend Gene Ford. And in closing every time I go up route 60, I will always remember stopping and talking while you were working on a wood project for your house in the driveway. Last thing if God asks you to build a basketball court, make sure you get a burn out railroad tie for the guys not playing to sit on. Your friend, classmate, and teammate Lintz.
