To Vickie's Family, I would like to express my condolences to Vickie's Family and those closest to her. Vickie had such a big heart and she touched a multitude of lives while here on earth. I was blessed and fortunate to be one of them. Vickie had been my nurse for about 13 years at my family medicine practice in Granville up until her illness began a year ago. It's hard to describe the profound effect she had on the many people she came in contact with while carrying out her nursing duties. She got to know the patients and they became her extended family. I only found out later (after she became ill) about the kind of "above and beyond" things she had done for many different people; many came forward praising her for the extra help and assistance (and love) she provided. At times, there were patients who tested her and tried her patience and sometimes were "mean as a striped snake," but soon, with a little time and understanding, Vickie would become their biggest ally. She was always advocating for the underdog and those who were most in need. She taught me a great deal about what was going on in their everyday lives. In nominating her for the Nurse of the Year Award, I described these things and felt that she embodied the very wise saying of Hippocrates: "Cure sometimes, treat often, comfort always." Her comforting way was one of her strongest attributes and a great blessing to those she touched. Personally, my family was also touched by her love and dedication. She was a frequent caregiver for our twin sons from infancy. She cared for them as she would her own and would always talk about how much she loved "those boys." Solomon and Sebastian loved her, too. Whenever someone is taken from us prematurely, I find myself asking what (if any) greater meaning or purpose is served in this tragedy. I think, perhaps, Vickie's example of selfless service might provide a clue to how we should live our lives more fully.
