## **William A. Cockerill**

**W**illiam A. "Bill" Cockerill, 85, of Dresden, Ohio, formerly of Newark, died Thursday morning, October 24, 2013 at Willow Haven Nursing Home in Zanesville.

Born November 20, 1927 in Buchanan, West Virginia he was a son of the late James B. and Cora (Ernest) Cockerill and he was an Army veteran having served during World War II. Mr. Cockerill was a former coal miner and construction worker working out of Local 423 Laborers Union of Columbus, Ohio.
