FRAZEYSBURG – Dale L. Modesitt, 64, of Frazzeysburg, Ohio died Thursday afternoon, May 17, 2012 at his home after a brief illness.

Born July 27, 1947 in Parkersburg, West Virginia he was a son of the late James L. and Mary A. (Jarrett) Modesitt and was a 1965 graduate of Union High School. Mr. Modesitt was an Army veteran serving during the Viet Nam War. He was a retired union laborer and worked for many years at the R. R. Donley Company. He later worked at Schwebel's Bakery. Mr. Modesitt was a member of the Rocky Fork Church of Christ, he loved gardening and was a avid outdoorsman enjoying both hunting and fishing.
