A funeral service for Lois J. Green, 83 of Newark will be held Monday, February 21, 2011 at 11 a.m. at the Church of God, God's Acres, 675 N. Cedar Street with Pastor Roger L. Decker and her son, Pastor Lee Green officiating. Burial will be in Wilson Cemetery.

Mrs. Green died Thursday February 17, 2011 at the Carroll Health Care Center in Carrollton, Ohio. She was born May 14, 1927 in Delaware, Ohio to the late Phillip Earl and Freda Pearl (Forrest) Nicholson.

Mrs. Green was a graduate of the 1948 class of St. Francis School of Nursing. She continued her nursing career for 32 years working in several area nursing homes until her retirement in 1980. Several of her family members have careers in the medical field from her influence on their lives. She was active in several businesses with her husband including; Charlie Brown's Pizza Shop in Zanesville, S & L Trucking, L J Produce and farm markets. She was a member of Church of God, God's Acres. She served as the nurse for many years at camp meetings. She will be remembered by her family for her wonderful storytelling talents.
