A funeral service for Charlene G. Burrell, 87 of Mineral City formerly Johnstown will be held Friday, October 24, 2014 at 1:00 p.m. in the Newark Chapel of Vensil & Chute Funeral Homes with Pastor Cindee Johnson officiating. Burial will be in Green Hill Cemetery, Johnstown.

Mrs. Burrell died Monday, October, 20, 2014 at her daughter's home. She was born February 19, 1927 in Columbus to John D. and Hazel M. (Haughn) Evans.

She was a member of the Johnstown United Methodist Church for over 50 years. She also was a member of the United Methodist Women Mary Circle, O.E. S. Juanita Chapter and Twig 22. She was a devoted mother and wife helping on the family farm. She loved being with her family and especially her great-granddaughter.
